FORD FREEDOM UNSUNG AWARD TO HONOR GANG ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM FOR SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE LOS ANGELES COMMUNITY

Kevin Frazier to host awards event, actress KeKe Palmer to serve as program ambassador

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (June 14, 2013) – The [Gang Alternatives Program](#) (GAP) has been selected to receive a Ford Freedom Unsung Award, presented by Ford Motor Company, in the organization category, for their work to prevent young children from joining gangs. GAP will be one of 20 Los Angeles honorees to be recognized by Ford at a special reception and program on June 19, 2013 at The GRAMMY Museum at L.A. LIVE.

The Gang Alternatives Program has championed the advancement of over 200,000 African American, Hispanic, and other minority children and families in Los Angeles by providing them with a way to say "no" to gangs and "yes" to a positive lifestyle. With a presence in nearly one-fourth of the elementary schools in the Los Angeles Unified School District, GAP provides a school-based youth gang prevention curriculum for 2nd, 4th, and 6th grades. GAP offers three [Beyond the Bell After School](#) programs, a proven effective school-based gang prevention education program in 45 elementary and middle schools; the Alternative Services for Youth program for emancipating fostered teens, and summer youth job programs. In addition, GAP provides a [graffiti abatement program](#) in Los Angeles City and County, bulky item pick up services, and community clean up services.
